New LCA website waits in the wings

The sparkling new LCA website is waiting in the wings, with the stage curtains due to rise in September.

LCA Business Manager Debbie Venz, who is project managing the enormous overhaul, says that the much-anticipated website will be a huge boost in communication and engagement across the LCA. 'We are going to have a facility that not only provides up-to-date information about all the ministries and functions of the LCA, but also ways of engaging people with them and motivating them to get involved.'

The project was initiated by Lutheran Media Ministry (LMM) as part of its commitment to use information and communication technologies to spread the gospel message as widely as possible.

'The internet is accessible to people all over the world', says LMM Director Rev Richard Mau. 'God has given us this remarkable resource, which costs relatively little to run and has the potential to reach literally millions of people. It is an opportunity we cannot afford to miss.'

Web manager David Mau, who is responsible for design and technical issues, and editor of The Lutheran Linda Macqueen, who is responsible for content and quality control, have been working hard on the project for three months.



'David and Linda are a formidable team, bringing together excellence in technology and communication', says Debbie. 'This is the first time they've worked together on a project of this magnitude, and it's clear that their complementary gifts are creating a communications tool that is going to be a real blessing for our church.'

'This is another example of what can be achieved when we work together, using the gifts God has given us through his people. I know many people are anxiously awaiting the website's unveiling.'

The website will contain regular features, news stories – 'we're aiming for an average of one new story up there every week day', Linda says – a Q&A section, and the ever-popular Daily Devotion page and Weekly Worship Planning page. An important innovation is the linking of the website to LAMP (Lutherans in Australasia Members Portal), which will ensure that details for contacting LCA personnel will be up to date on the website at all times.

The exact launch date will be announced shortly.

LCA DVD Worship Service now available.

Filming has begun and Worship Services on DVD are now available each week for congregations and individuals. The DVDs are produced by Lutheran Media Ministry in cooperation with the Commission on Worship. In order to make the DVDs available as widely as possible there will be no charge for them. 
