

Hymnic services with holy communion for festival days

The following three forms of the communion service, for Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost, were prepared by members of the Department of Liturgics in 1994 and 1995. They have been used in a few congregations, and are here released for further trial use.

Hymnic service with holy communion for Christmas day

NOTES

- 1 The service follows the outline of the regular divine service with holy communion, with variations for Christmas.
- 2 Well-known hymn/carol verses and tunes have been used for sung parts of the liturgy.
- 3 A gospel procession is suggested as an option, to highlight the coming of Christ into the midst of his people. It may be done as follows. After the acclamation 'Glory to you, O Lord', two servers, each carrying a lit candle, go to the lectern and stand one on each side of it. A third server picks up the open Bible or lectionary, and the three walk side by side, with the minister following, to about a quarter or a third of the way down the central aisle of the nave. There the server carrying the Bible turns and holds it up while the minister reads the gospel from it. After the reading, and during the second acclamation 'Praise to you, O Christ', the procession returns the Bible to the lectern.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Friends in Christ: Jesus says: 'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.' Let us confess our sins to God our Father, and ask him to forgive us through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Lord God, our heavenly Father,

I am a sinner

and I have sinned against you,

not only in my words and actions,

but also in my secret thoughts and desires

which I cannot fully know or understand,

but which you know completely.

I am sorry that I have displeased you,

and repent of the evil I have done.

For the sake of your dear Son,

Jesus Christ our Lord,

**have mercy on me,
forgive my sins,
and graciously help me in my weakness. Amen.**

As a called and ordained servant of the word, I announce the grace of God to all of you. On behalf of my Lord Jesus Christ, and by his command, I forgive the sins of all of you who repent and believe, in the name of the Father and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit.

After the reading:

(If not earlier)

SECOND READING

After the reading:

This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

HALLELUJAH RESPONSE

(Spoken)

When the right time finally came, God sent his own Son. Hallelujah!

The Lord said to me: You are my son; today I have become your father.

Hallelujah!

GOSPEL

A gospel procession may be held.

The gospel is announced.

Glory to you, O Lord.

After the reading:

This is the gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

(Sung to the tune of Forest Green, LH 633)

O holy child of Bethlehem,

descend to us, we pray;

cast out our sin, and enter in;

be born in us today.

NICENE CREED
